

Open Enrollment 2023 Is Almost

Over - Enroll Today!

Open enrollment—your once-a-year opportunity to enroll in or make changes to your employee benefits—ends this Friday, November 18 at midnight. Don't miss your chance to make the benefits choices that are right for you and your family.

We encourage everyone to review their benefits during open enrollment; however, you do not need to act unless you want to make a change to your current benefits or contribute to a flexible spending account (FSA) or dependent care spending account (DCSA).

An important word about enrolling

While you have until Friday at midnight to finalize your benefits elections for next year, the Office of Employee Benefits will be closing Friday at 4 p.m. After that time, we will not be available to assist you. For that reason, we ask that you do not wait until the last minute to enroll. If you do not complete your 2023 benefits enrollment by end of day Friday, you will not be able to make any changes until next year's open enrollment (unless you have a qualifying status change).

Have You Considered...

- Your needs may have changed since last year, and a
 different medical, dental, or vision option may be better
 for you. Visit the Office of Employee Benefits website to see
 full plan details; watch vendor presentations, and download
 the FAQ on the virtual benefits fair; and talk to ALEX, the
 State's online interactive decision tool.
- This year, you'll be able to add to your supplemental life insurance with a new 2-times-salary coverage option (up to \$300,000). If you currently have supplemental life insurance at 1 times your salary, you can elect the increase to 2 times during open enrollment without having to provide any proof of good health. If you do not have supplemental life insurance yet and you would like to elect it during this year's open enrollment period, you will be subject to The Hartford's evidence of insurability requirements.
